

In the transit class, out of a total of 45 contestants, **Josh Simpkins** from **Montgomery County** placed **FIRST IN THE NATION**, and **Tyler Reynolds** from **Virginia Beach** placed TWENTY-SIXTH.

Drivers who place in the top 10 were given a trophy. In addition, Josh Simpkins who placed 1st in the transit class was given a special plaque to bring back to his supervisor, **Rebecca Mummau**. Rebecca is the VAPT director for Region 6 and has held local road-e-o's since their inception in Virginia in the 1980's. She says she would strongly encourage more localities in Virginia to sponsor their own local school bus road-e-o or "safety competition" as she prefers to call it. She feels that it is a great way for drivers to improve their driving skills while having fun at the same time.
