Public Schools The cornerstone of the SNT Program, this course uses the most recent edition of the NAPT Manual for Transporting Children with Disabilities, written by Dr. Linda Bluth, to explore the legal basis for special needs transportation. It highlights the differences between laws & policies, parti- cularly as they affect operations & includes definitions of transportation & related special education terms, trans- portation requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act; the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments; & the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. There is a specific focus on the characteristics of children with disabilities and the relation- ship of the Individualized Education Program (IEP) process to the provision of the related service transportation. Scenarios are used to discuss multiple hot topics including discipline, climate controlled school buses, door-to-door transportation, medication and oxygen transport.
